Phoenix Class

Phoenix Class began their new English book, *I Will Not Ever Eat a Tomato*, with a fruit and vegetable tasting session, using adjectives like fresh, juicy and sour to write about the food. In History the children loved imagining what they would do if they were king or queen for a day, which led to some brilliant discussions and writing. In Maths, KS1 have begun their multiplication and division unit. Reception explored the composition of 5 with songs *5 Little Speckled Frogs* and *5 Little Aliens* and die frames. They stretched this to numbers 6 and 7 with ideas like, "What would happen if we had 6 aliens on the spaceship?

Gryphon Class

We have begun our new class book *Lost Thing* by Shaun Tan, and the children are already showing great curiosity about its unusual characters and themes. In maths, we have continued exploring fractions through a range of fun and practical activities. As part of Storytelling Week, the children created their own raps and enjoyed sharing stories with one another. Today's Forest School session was a big hit — the children loved sliding down the banks and making the most of the outdoor space. Expect muddy children! Next week, we will be taking part in a live lesson for Safer Internet Day to help the children learn how to stay safe online.


